The Niels Hjorth Prize

The International Contact Dermatitis Research Group encourages research by endowing the Niels Hjorth Prize. Original, unpublished papers are invited, and a committee will then select the winner. The winning entry will be given as a paper at the 14th International Symposium on Contact Dermatitis in Seoul, Korea, September 19–21, 2003 (20 min presentation).

The paper has to be written in English, focused exclusively on contact dermatitis and can be experimentally or clinically orientated.

The amount of the prize money has been raised to 3,000 EUR, and due to the long distance to Seoul, it has been divided into

1,500 EUR for the grant itself

1,500 EUR for travelling expenses and oral presentation.
